Features

	Description
Midi Format	The music files in this library are "midi" files (Musical Instrument Digital Interface, extension ".mid"), an industry-standard interface format used on electronic musical keyboards and PCs for computer control of musical instruments and devices.
Player Software	Midi player software must be installed on your computer in order to listen to midi files on your sound card and speakers. If you surf the web regularly for music files, you probably already have a midi player installed on your computer.
Instrument	By default, the midi files produce sound using midi channel 20 'Church Organ' (channel 19, if numbering starts at 0 on your player). The instrument assignment can be changed using midi editing software.
Midi Editing	You can edit the midi performance (tempo, key, notes, instrument, etc.) using midi editing software. Both free and purchased midi editing software is widely available on the web.
Keyboards with Disk Drives	Electronic keyboards with disk drives can usually play midi files by creating a copy of the file on a floppy disk or CD and inserting it into the keyboard's disk drive.

Installation

- **ZIP install:** If your Midi Library was delivered in a ZIP file, unzip the entire contents of the zip file to your hard disk, then click the file 'index.html' to open the Midi Library.
- **CD/DVD install:** If your Midi Library was delivered on a CD or DVD, insert the CD/DVD into your drive and Windows will automatically autorun the Midi Library in your browser; on other platforms (or if autorun fails to start) click the file 'index.html' to open the Midi Library.
- **USB Drive install:** If your Midi Library was delivered on a USB drive, insert the USB drive into a connector port on your computer, open the USB drive folder, and click the file 'index.html' to open the Midi Library.
- **Hard Disk:** You may copy the Midi Library files onto your hard disk for more convenient access and faster response; copy all of the files and the entire folder structure.
- **Midi Files:** Direct access to the midi files is provided by opening the folder 'midi' in the root folder of each hymnal's installation.

System Requirements

- Use MS Internet Explorer or Firefox browsers on Windows systems; use Safari on the Mac.
- Midi player software is required to play the midi files on your computer; free players include Apple Quicktime and Microsoft Windows Media Player; both are available for free download.
