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Preface

Wherever Christians gather together to worship and praise God, we sing songs—songs that express our guilt due to sin, our contrition and confession, and our faith, hope and joy of God's grace and salvation. Throughout history Christians have joined together in singing hymns of praise to a loving God. Lutherans in particular are blessed with a great heritage of Christian music. The Lutheran hymnals commonly used in our American churches today are truly a blessing from our Lord.

The goal of A Collection of Lutheran Music is to help Christians praise God with music and song. This Collection of music provides simplified chordbooks, midi files, concordances and audio CDs as supplements to the common Lutheran hymnals and is aimed at increasing the number of people who can enjoy studying, listening to and playing this cherished music themselves.

Hymnal Concordance

A concordance is an alphabetical index of all the words in a text or corpus of texts, showing every contextual occurrence of a word. This concordance indexes the hymn stanzas found in the Lutheran hymnal Evangelical Lutheran Worship published in 2006 by Augsburg Fortress.

The Evangelical Lutheran Worship Concordance is available in two versions. This book is the Abridged Concordance. It includes entries for the significant words in the hymnal (excluding common prepositions, pronouns, verbs, and articles). The CD that accompanies the book contains the browser-based Unabridged Concordance that indexes all the words that appear in the hymnal and is very convenient for computer use.

The statistics below compare the contents of the *Unabridged* and *Abridged* versions:

- Unabridged Concordance: 5,060 words, 85,948 phrases indexed
- Abridged Concordance: 4,717 words, 40,174 phrases indexed

Each phase entry in the concordance is preceded by a reference. For example, the entry

710.2.9 O great weaver of our fabric,

under the word **FABRIC** has the reference "710.2.9" which means the phrase "O great weaver of our *fabric*," is found in Hymn 710, Stanza 2, Phrase 9. The abbreviations Ti, Re, or Al shown in some references indicate the word is found in the hymn Title, Refrain, or Alleluia Refrain, respectively.

Media Formats

The Evangelical Lutheran Worship concordance is available in several media formats. The Abridged Concordance is available as both a printed book and as an Abobe PDF file (Portable Document Format) that can be downloaded from the Lutheran Music web site. The Unabridged Concordance is available on a computer CD accompanying the printed book, or as a ZIP file downloaded from the web site.

In preparing A Collection of Lutheran Music for publication every effort has been made to respect the intellectual property rights of the copyright holders. Other than indexing short phrases, neither the Abridged nor the Unabridged version contains full hymn texts that are under copyright protection.


